

Application Review Committee and Scoring Criteria for Grant Award

Review Committee

Department of Economic Development (DED) staff and a select committee of planning and design professionals will serve as a Review Committee. Applications will be evaluated by the Review Committee and then processed for approval by DED.

Complete applications will be scored by the Review Committee and awards will be based on the strength of proposals, readiness to begin work, and funding availability. Projects that are rated highest will be eligible for funding first. Projects that are equally ranked will be selected based upon the time of receipt of the completed applications.

Scoring Criteria

The Façade and Streetscape Improvement Review Committee will evaluate applications for eligibility and how effectively they meet the program criteria utilizing a scoring system. A total point score will be based on the sum of the ratings. The program criteria are as follows:
